CNOS FAP is a member of the Erasmus+ strategic partnership project "MedNC: a network for the successful integration of young NEETs".

According to the ILO, 71 million young people around the world, aged between 15 and 24 years, looked for but did not find work in 2017. This is particularly true in the Mediterranean Basin with a growing percentage of young people joining the Not in Education, Employment or Training (NEET) category. This concerns 1 young person out of 3 in Tunisia, 1 young person out of 4 in Italy and 1 young person out of 6 in France.

In order to respond to these challenges, the MedNC network gathers Euro-Mediterranean socio-professional insertion structures to strengthen the qualitative and quantitative impact of their action and inform the state of these initiatives. Today, it represents more than 26,000 young people and 100 partner centers in 9 countries (Algeria, Egypt, Spain, France, Lebanon, Morocco, Portugal, Tunisia, Italy). The network is supported by the Union for the Mediterranean, the French Development Agency, the Drosos Foundation, and the European Union via the Erasmus + program. 
The Erasmus+ strategic partnership project "MedNC: a network for the successful integration of young NEETs" supports the network's missions and objectives.
